Competition This competition is open to qualified skaters who are registered members of United States Figure Skating Association or a Friendly Foreign Federation. Skaters representing a Foreign Association must include official permission of their Association or Federation. Basic Skills skaters need not be full club members but must be registered through US Figure Skating as a Basic Skills member. This is a non-qualifying competition and will be governed by the current US Figure Skating Rulebook, except as modified by this announcement. All Skaters and Coaches are encouraged to check the US Figure Skating website www.usfsa.org for all current rule changes, clarifications and updates.

Judging All events will be judged on the 6.0 system or as otherwise noted in this announcement.

Entries Complete and mail with entry fee to REGISTRAR WINTER GAMES, Post Office Box 351, Sun Valley, ID 83353. Please include an email address on your entry to receive schedules for competition and practice ice. **Entries must be postmarked by January 15, 2009.** Late entries will be accepted at the discretion of the LOC. If you are registering late, you must also contact the Registrar by telephone at 208/ 622-8020 OR via email at info@sunvalleyfsc.com. We also encourage any additional questions or communications be handled via email at info@sunvalleyfsc.com. Please use only U.S. Postal mail to submit entries. **FEDERAL EXPRESS IS NOT AVAILABLE AT OUR P.O. BOX. THE ONLY OVERNIGHT SERVICE IS THE US MAIL. NO FAXED ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED.** A fee of \$35.00 will be charged for checks returned for non-sufficient funds (NSF). To withdraw, notify the Registrar immediately at info@sunvalleyfsc.com or by telephone 208-622-8020.

Eligibility Competition level will be governed by tests passed as of January 15, 2009 and age as of February 21, 2009. All skaters should be prepared to show proof of age. Any skater may enter one event higher than the event for which he/she qualifies by Free Skating test.

Refunds There will be no refunds on entry fees or practice ice. In any event, with only one entry, the referee reserves the right to combine this skater with a similar type group, or if this is not possible, the skater will skate against the book.

Events with large numbers of entries may be split into multiple, equal-sized groups. In this case, events will be split by age for Non-Test through Preliminary and by draw for Pre-Juvenile through Senior. The Referee and LOC also reserve the right to combine Ladies and Men's events where permitted by the current US Figure Skating rulebook. Events divided by age may also be combined in the case of insufficient entries. No final rounds will be skated. The short and long program will be scored as separate events. No combined scores will be given. Events may be skated with more than 6 skaters per warm up group. All Short Program elements to be skated in accordance with the 2008-2009 rulebook.

Liability Skaters, parents and coaches are encouraged to read the current section of the US Figure Skating Rulebook regarding the club facility and US Figure Skating liability. Your signature on the entry form will indicate that you have read this section.

Registration The registration desk will be open from 5 to 7 pm on Friday February 20, 2009 and remain open during the competition and practice ice hours.

Facilities The Sun Valley Resort maintains two adjacent ice surfaces, one indoor and the other outdoor. Indoor ice dimensions are 95' x 190' with rounded corners. Outdoor ice dimensions are approximately 90' x 180' with slightly rounded corners. All events and official practice ice will be held on the indoor arena.

Admission No admission fees will be charged.

Music Competitors are asked to turn in a CD of their music to the registration desk no later than **one hour prior** to the event. Music will be available for pick-up at the registration desk after the event has been completed. Please bring a back up CD for emergencies. CD's (NOT THE CASE) must be clearly marked with the name of the skater, the music time and the event being entered. Please write directly on the disc and **DO NOT USE LABELS**. Music must be the first program on the disc and only one program per disc. Please use only **CDRs**. **NO CASSETTES WILL BE ACCEPTED.**

Awards Awards will be given as quickly as possible after each event. Medals will be awarded for 1st through 3rd place. All entrants will receive participation ribbons.

Official Notices The official schedule showing starting times for each event and the draw will be posted in the indoor arena. The official schedule supersedes all other schedules. Notices posted on the SVFSC bulletin board (or adjacent to) located in the indoor rink are considered as sufficient notice to all competitors. Skaters are to be in the rink and ready to skate **60** minutes before their event is scheduled to begin. In the event that the competition runs ahead of schedule, events will not be delayed for skaters who arrive late. Decisions by the Referee in all matters will be final.

Practice Ice Official Practice Ice will be made available through the Sun Valley Figure Skating Club. Please send practice ice reservations along with your entry no later than January 15th, 2009. A schedule will be emailed to skaters soon as possible after the close of the entries.

Basic Skills Events The purpose of the Basic Skills events offered by the Winter Games is to promote a fun introduction to the competitive experience for the beginner skater. Skaters must either be members of a US Figure Skating Club or US Figure Skating Basic Skills Program. Skaters **may have** passed the US Figure Skating Pre-Pre moves in the Field test and still skate in Freestyle 1 – 6 events. The accompanying announcement for the regular US Figure Skating events will govern this Basic Skills competition, or as modified by this announcement.

Showcase and Artistic Events

Artistic will be skated as a rhythmic interpretation to music of the skater's choice. It is open to both men and women. It will be judged on composition and style. The difficulty of jumps will not be rewarded as such and should be used as all elements in the performance to enhance the overall style, choreography and artistic value. Vocal music is permitted. Skaters are encouraged to wear conservative costumes, appropriate for their music. No props are allowed, including hand-held. At the discretion of the Referee, similar groups may be combined and/or divided according to the number of skaters entered. Each judge will award one mark to each skater for presentation. All program times listed for artistic events are maximums. Judges for the Artistic events may include members of the local artistic community, as well as skating judges.

Showcase will be skated to music of the skater's choice and is open to both men and women. This is a theatrical costume event. Props are limited to one trip on the ice, must be carried or pushed by the skater and may not alter the ice surface, i.e. fire or water. The event will be judged on interpretation, style, composition and entertainment appeal. At the discretion of the Referee, similar groups may be combined and/or divided according to the number of skaters entered. The difficulty of jumps will not be rewarded as such and should be used as all elements in the performance to enhance the overall style, choreography and entertainment value. Each judge will award one mark to each skater for presentation. All program times listed for Showcase events are maximums. Judges for the showcase events may include members of the local artistic community, as well as skating judges.

Showcase Pairs: This includes mixed pairs, or pairs of the same sex. Groups may be divided by age, based upon entries received. Time: 2 minutes max. (+or -10sec) All other requirements are as specified for Showcase. Each judge will award one mark to each pair for presentation. All program times listed are maximums.

Interpretive Improvisation This consists of a performance choreographed by an unaided contestant to music supplied by the organizers, 1:00 for Basic Skills through Pre-Juvenile, and 1:30 for Juvenile through Senior. Skaters will have a 10-minute off-ice period with only their group in a secluded room where music is played continuously. Skaters must be ready in the designated Indoor ice rink locker room at least 15 minutes before their event is scheduled. The group will then have a 3-minute on-ice warm-up for non-test through pre-juvenile, 5 minutes for Juvenile through Senior, during which time the music will be played twice. Skaters will be awarded one mark for presentation. Judging will be on interpretation, style and composition. At the discretion of the Referee, similar groups may be combined and/or divided according to the number of skaters entered. Parents and coaches will not be permitted to join competitors in the room or to assist skaters on the ice.

Videotaping/Photography

A professional photographer will be available in the arena. Professional videotaping will also be available. All other videotaping and photography is restricted to hand-held battery operated equipment without tripod. No flash photography.

Basic Skills Event Qualifications

Eligibility for Snowplow Sam through Basic 8 will be based upon the skill level as of the closing date of the entries. All Snowplow Sam and Basic Skills Skaters through Basic 8 must skate at their highest level passed and NO OFFICIAL US FIGURE SKATING TESTS may have been passed including MIF or individual dances. Events for Basic skaters will be offered in Compulsory, Free skate, Artistic, Showcase and Improvisational.

Eligibility for Free skate 1-6 will be based upon the skill level as of the closing date of the entries. Skaters may have passed official US Figure Skating MIF test or individual dances and still be eligible to enter these events. Skaters must compete at the highest level passed or one level higher but not both levels at the same event during the same competition. Events for Free skate 1-6 will be offered in Compulsory, Free skate, Artistic, Showcase and Improvisational.

Events offered for Intermediate through Senior will be Short, Freeskate, Artistic, Showcase and Improvisational.

Events may be skated with more than six skaters per warm-up group. Skaters must skate US Figure Skating elements for the Short Program as written for the 2009-2010 season in the current US Figure Skating Rulebook.

Compulsory Moves Non- Test thru Open Juvenile.

Age and test requirements are the same as Free Skating. Open to both men and women. Compulsory moves will be skated without music **ON HALF ICE.** Required moves may be done in any order, without stops between elements. Each additional or repeated element will be penalized by .2. Connecting footwork is allowed but may not include half jumps. Combination jumps may not have a change of foot or turn between the jumps. Skaters will receive one mark from each judge for Technical Merit.
